Eminent Domain | Condemnation

Eminent Domain or Condemnation historically involved a local, state or federal government taking of private property for a public use. Most of the time, property would be taken for roadways, electric transmission lines or oil and gas pipelines. However, since 2005 when the Supreme Court broadened the definition of “public use” to include any structure intended to generally benefit the community, including shopping malls, hotels, condos, and health clubs, developer involvement in eminent domain/condemnation proceedings has increased considerably.

The eminent domain process and subsequent litigation is unique in the litigation world. This rapidly changing area of the law is a combination of administrative law and litigation and thus requires a full understanding of the nuances involved in this type of legal matter compared to other types of litigation. Flowers Davis attorneys have successfully represented both plaintiffs and defendants in local, intrastate and interstate eminent domain/condemnation proceedings in both State and Federal court. We regularly represent oil and gas pipeline companies and cities in these proceedings.

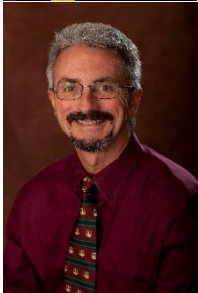
